Cash Flow Management – Cut Costs

- Control costs
- Cash flow budget
- Renegotiate rents, fixed expenses
- Reduce or eliminate capital spending
- Minimize staffing expenses
- Trade or barter for supplies
- Inventories Reduce, Cut Cost, Reduce Inventory Turns
- Examine Customer Base
- Ask for help employees, customers, vendors, family



Cash Flow Management – Increase Revenue

- Keep and/or get the cash flowing
- Look for new revenue sources adapt and pivot
- Adjust marketing plan for products
- Pricing
- Get paid quicker deal with problem customers
- Diversify
- Consider discounts, vouchers, presale
- Short-term financing
- Reduce accounts receivable



Cash Flow Management – Manage Liabilities

- Extend loan terms
- Negotiate operating debt to longer term
- Pay interest only
- Increase collateral, marketing guarantees or contracts
- Reduce debt
- Refinance
- Liquidate cash investments
- Sell capital assets



Know Your Numbers

- Accounting and bookkeeping get involved
- Balance up that balance sheet
- Income statements cash flow versus profitability
- Cash flow statements
- Cash flow projections
- Break-even anlysis



Your Monthly Cash Flow Review

- Are your accounts receivable late?
- Is your inventory turning slow?
- Are you controlling your expenses?
- Is your business undercapitalized?
- Are you hitting budget targets?
- Are you reviewing payroll expenses?
- How is your timing on accounts payable?
- Are you prepared to bounce back?
