

Quality fiber

- Good breeding stock
 - Healthy, young sheep
- · Good management
 - Shear near lambing, as lambing often creates a weak spot in the fiber
 - Lambing, illness can cause breakage in the wool
 - Good nutrition is essential for producing high quality fiber

Price differentials

- Wool pool prices hardly cover shearing costs
 - \$3-\$6 per head to shear
 - Fleeces weigh 5 10 lb
 - Wool pool prices ~ \$0.50 per
- Premium handspinning fleeces go for as much as \$180 for 4.5 lb!
 - That's the asking price!

Coats for your sheep



- Rocky Sheep Company, rockysheep.com, has very sturdy sheep coats made from breathable woven nylon, 1000 denier
- Prices range from \$19 \$28, depending on size
- Reduces sun damage and contamination from feed, bedding, and manure
- Covered fleeces command a much, much higher price
- Uncovered fleeces are hard to sell to fiber artists





2019 Small Farm Webinar Series

Price differentials

- Typically in the neighborhood of \$10-\$25 per lb
- · Covered fleeces sell quickly and for a premium
- Higher prices for smaller, premium quantities

Skirting fleece



- Use a skirting table
- Remove belly and leg wool
- Remove coarse breech wool in leg area
- Remove greasy tags along rear and sides near sweat glands
- Remove vegetable matter (VM)
- Remove any manure or soiled
- Shake off or pick off second cuts
- · This can take a long time!

Storing fleece

- · Wool is prone to felting if compressed
- · Plastic bags are not great for storing fleeces as they can retain moisture, causing felting
- Cardboard boxes that are big enough to accommodate the fleece without compressing it are best
- · Moths are a destructive pest! - Mothballs are toxic
 - Herbal approaches somewhat effective

- · Washed fleece
- Dyed fleece
- Carded roving
- Quilt batts
- Spun yarn
- Blankets
- Socks

Do the math first!



- Shipping
- Washing
 - I washed my own fleece
 - Saved money and shipping weight
- Carding
- Spinning into yarn
- Creating uniform skeins
- Packaging
- Any wholesale margin??

Calculating shrink

- 40% 60% loss in scouring (washing)
- 5% 10% loss in each carding operation
- 100 lb of raw wool yields 40 to 60 lb of clean wool
- 50 lb of clean wool yields 45 lb of roving
- 10 lb of raw wool is 4.5 lb of roving

Calculating costs for custom services

- At \$10 per lb, you are paying \$100 for 10 lb but you are getting 4.5 lb of roving, so that's \$22 per lb (\$100/4.5) Loss due to grease & dirt
- You pay \$45 for scouring 100 lb @ \$4.50/lb and \$30 for carding (\$6.75/lb finished weight), so another \$17 per lb (\$75/4.5 lb)
- Total cost is \$39 per lb (\$22 + \$17)






